Note from Administrator

We have entered the time period of our school year where we work to finish the current year strong and are deeply involved in developing plans for next year. Those families with their youngest graduating feel an array of emotions looking back over the past many years of school, yet pressing forward into post high school choices. Regardless of where you are in your homeschool journey, the months of February thru April are filled with choices, and for some that can be overwhelming. Begin and end in prayer, seeking the Lord's counsel.

While planning for next year, start with core courses – language arts and mathematics. These are by far the most important for all grade levels. If your student is in upper grades determine if you will use an outside source for these courses – SRJC, Campus Day class, online class such as Potters School, day school class, etc or if you feel confident to teach it yourself at home. Once you have the two core courses planned, move to the Campus Day schedule and fill in courses with your child that you plan to have them take. Next look at what's left. Do they take music lessons? Are they involved in a sports team? Does your teen work outside the home? These courses should be added. For high school, double check graduation requirements and update the HS tracking sheet. To finish, pray about how Bible will be covered for your family. Do you have family devotions? Will dad lead the whole family in study throughout the year? Will your child take an outside Bible study or use a specific curriculum? Bible should be the subject that covers all the rest, fully integrated throughout.
